Introduction:

SUMMER EXTENDED DAY (For Students entering Grades 1-4)

Tewksbury Public Schools is pleased to announce the continuation of our Full and Half Day Extended Day Summer Program for students residing in Tewksbury and entering Grades 1-4. We offer your child a full complement of enriching activities in a safe, well-supervised environment at the North Street School. Daily enrichment activities will include arts and crafts, a recreation/game room, outside water/sprinkler activities, playground, computers, and gym. Each Thursday will feature a special event, play, or other activity. One day per week we will travel to Greater Lawrence Technical for swimming. There will be field trips available for an additional fee to cover the cost of transportation and/or admission charge.

ADVENTURE PROGRAM (For Students entering Grades 5-9)

Tewksbury Public Schools is pleased to announce that the Full and Half Day Extended Day Summer Program for students residing in Tewksbury and entering Grades 5-9 will continue at the Wynn Middle School. Each day will feature cooperative games, leadership activities, team and adventure sports, and arts and crafts. There will be field trips available one day per week for an additional fee to cover the cost of transportation and/or admission charge. One day per week we will travel to Greater Lawrence Technical for swimming.

WEEKLY ENRICHMENT CLASSES

In addition to the Summer Extended Day Programs, Tewksbury Community Services Division of Tewksbury Public Schools is pleased to provide Weekly Enrichment Classes for children of Tewksbury residents only. These enrichment classes are in the areas of Academics, Creative Arts, Fine Arts, and Sports. For a complete listing of the classes offered, please refer to pages 8-17. Classes will be held at Tewksbury Memorial High School, unless otherwise noted. Each participant will receive a T-shirt. Please circle your child's shirt size on the registration form. **Course specific T-shirts are ordered 10 days before each class starts. After that time, participants will receive a comparable T-shirt.**

TRAVEL ADVISORY

Be advised that the sewer work will commence this summer on Pleasant Street. The entrance to the High School and the entrance to the Ryan School will be accessible from Main Street or Whipple Road, but may not necessarily be accessible from both directions at the same time.

Summer Program Procedures:

BEFORE SCHOOL PROGRAM PROCEDURES

- Parents/Guardians must provide transportation to all of the Summer Programs and Courses.
- Children must be walked into the school each morning/afternoon.
- All parents must sign-in upon arrival.

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM PROCEDURES

- Parents/Guardians must provide transportation home from all of the Summer Programs and Courses.
- Parents/Guardians must sign-out each day and let the staff know that you and your child are leaving.

PICK-UP

It is important that your child is picked up promptly. Parents/Guardians arriving late will be charged a late fee of \$5.00 for every five (5) minutes they are late after the end of a session. **Continual abuse of this pick-up policy may result in exclusion from the program.**

PROCEDURES FOR PICKING UP YOUR CHILD

Only a child's parent/guardian or a person designated **IN WRITING** by the child's parent/guardian will be allowed to pick up the child. **No child will be released to anyone other than a parent/guardian without the signed permission of the parent/guardian.** Please be aware that if the staff does not know the person you have designated to pick-up your child, that person will be asked for photo identification.

EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBERS

Make sure that the Summer Program staff knows where to contact you **AT ALL TIMES** while your child is attending the program. If you are not going to be at your usual number, please let the staff know where they can reach you in the case of an emergency. If you are going to be out of town, let the staff know whom to contact in your place. All parents/guardians are asked to provide the names and phone numbers of at least two **local** people to call if the parent/guardian cannot be reached. It is your responsibility to complete the accident/illness form and to keep all information up-to-date.

LUNCH/SNACKS

Since there is no cafeteria staff on duty in the summer, you must provide lunch/snacks, water, and juices for your children. Also, please keep in mind that there is no refrigeration available for lunch storage.

Tuition Policies:

1. Tuition payments for the **Summer Extended Day Program** and the **Adventure Program** are to be made on each Friday prior to the week your child will be attending. Early payments will be gladly accepted. **Times for both programs:** **Full days** are 7:30AM to 5:30PM and **Half Days** are 7:30AM to 12:30PM or 12:30PM to 5:30PM.
2. Tuition payment, with the exception of the initial registration for the **Extended Day Summer Programs**, should be submitted to the Site Director at the North Street School or Wynn Middle School. Payments for the **Weekly Enrichment Classes** should be made at the time of registration.
3. **Late payments:** A late fee of \$15.00 will be assessed on any **Extended Day** tuition paid after the due date. Missing two consecutive payments will result in your child being excluded from the program.
4. **Sibling Discount:** A discounted tuition rate of 10% off the second child and 15% off the third child in the family will be applied to students attending the **Full Week, 5 Day, Full Day, Extended Day Summer Program or Adventure Program**.

With the exception of Golf, there is a \$5.00 discount for a **second** sibling taking the same course in the **Weekly Enrichment Classes**. There are no other sibling discounts.

5. **Absences:** No refunds will be made for any absences due to illness, family commitments, etc.
6. Tuition payments for the **Weekly Enrichment Classes** are to be made at the time of the registration. Refer to pages 8-17 for a listing of the courses offered.
7. **Cash payments will not be accepted.** Checks or money orders should be made payable to "Town of Tewksbury".
8. **Please include your child's name and program on the memo line of your check.** This will assist in processing, and will insure that your check will be credited to your account.
9. **Returned Checks:** Checks that are returned by your bank for any reason will be subject to a \$25.00 returned check fee. A returned check must be replaced by a money order in the amount of the check plus the \$25.00 fee.

Tuition Policies (continued)

Failure to resolve this matter within 30 days will result in a status change to "**Money Order Only**" which means checks will no longer be accepted as forms of payment.

10. **Late Pick-up Fee:** A fee of \$5.00 for every five (5) minutes after 5:30 p.m., (or 12:30 p.m. for the AM half-day program or at the end of the enrichment class) will be charged for each late pick-up. **Continual abuse of this pick-up time may result in exclusion from the Program.**

Accident/Illness Form and Consent/Release Form:

It is imperative that we have an updated Accident/Illness Form for each child that is registered in our summer programs. Registrations **WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED** without a completed Accident/Illness Form and a completed Consent/Release Form. You will find these forms in the Center Pull Out Section.

Student Discipline Guidelines:

In the case of inappropriate behavior, parents and/or guardians will be notified verbally and in writing by staff. In the case of repeated infractions, students will be suspended. Continued violation of rules will result in expulsion from the program.

Also, in the case of any behavior that creates an unsafe environment for students and/or staff, the student will be suspended or expelled immediately from the program.

ACADEMICS

ACADEMIC SUPPORT PROGRAM

This program is designed to assist students **entering grades 3 through 8** who are in need of English Language Arts and Mathematics support. The program will operate for three (3) weeks. Children will receive instruction in both English Language Arts and Mathematics. Each child will be given a pre-and post-test to determine his/her academic need. Small class sizes will enable our staff to service your child in the areas that he/she needs assistance. Progress reports will be provided weekly. This is a great opportunity for students to gain confidence and receive that extra boost before returning to school in late August! **Transportation will be the responsibility of the parents/guardians.** (Please be sure to enter the grade your child will be entering in the fall of 2008 at the top of the registration form.)

CREATIVE WRITING

Ms. Pat Whitehouse, of the Community Education staff, will, for the second year, offer an exciting one-week course in creative writing. In this class, students will create a newspaper containing news articles, book reviews, recipes, etc. Using Microsoft Word, they will compile all their work into a unique "magazine" that they can bring home and share with their families and friends. SPANISH

We will introduce important verbs that will empower students to build dozens of sentences within the first three days. By the end of the course, students will be able to express what they need, want, like, can, have to do, are going to do, ask simple questions, understand basic directions, and, most of all, they will get a sense of accomplishment from speaking a foreign language. This is an ideal course for those who never studied a foreign language. Students should bring a pack of index cards and colored markers. **(Class limit is 16.)**

ACRYLIC PAINTING

Ms. Joan Turner, of the Community Education staff, will offer an introduction course to painting with Acrylic paint for students **ages 13 and up.** We will be using various techniques and subject matter in this course. A general or beginner knowledge of drawing is helpful in creating art work with Acrylic paints. Students are responsible for supplies and materials, including: brushes, (a combination of sizes as well as round and square headed), canvas, (8x10, 11x14), sketching pencils, a kneaded rubber eraser, and a palette for mixing paint.

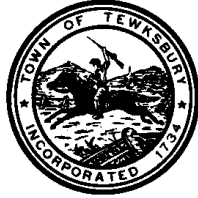
